METHODOLOGY

1. Institutional graduation rate is based on the cohort of Occupational Associate (OA) degree students who completed their programs in the reported calendar year (2022) within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates. Both the Associate of Science and Bachelor of Science programs are new and were therefore not included in the institutional graduation rate. The Bachelor of Science degree programs began on 7/1/2018 and the Associate of Science degree programs began on 2/8/2021.

2. Institutional placement rate is based on the cohort of Occupational Associate Degree students who completed their programs in the reported calendar year (2022) within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, and are 1) gainfully employed 2) whose employment has been reported 3) and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. Both the Associate of Science and Bachelor of Science programs are new and were therefore not included in the institutional graduation rate. The Bachelor of Science degree programs began on 7/1/2018 and the Associate of Science degree programs began on 2/8/2021.
